

Head teacher's Message

This week has been a very wet one but that didn't stop classes getting out and about for their forest school sessions. Children absolutely loved getting messy, and there was some amazing teamwork with den building and bulb planting—it will be interesting to see where they come up in the spring! As previously mentioned, children will now get access to Forest School and beach school throughout the year using the following structure.

Reception—weekly up to summer term

Years 1 & 2—fortnightly up to summer term (with a weekly block offsite in the Spring)

Years 3—6—weekly block sessions for one term off site

Whole school—weekly beach school in summer term.

The new topics have begun this week and the children are getting excited about the new learning to come. We are also starting to think about what we can do for Christmas this year, so keep a look out for future dates!

We have a few thing coming up next week:

Tuesday 9th November—FOSS meeting. It has been a while since we had an active FOSS committee up and running. As you all know, school budgets are tight, and anything that can be done to pay for the enrichment activities that the children would love is much appreciated. The plan on Tuesday is to discuss ways that we can run fund raising events for the school in a manageable way. Please feel free to come along, we may even have biscuits!

Friday 12th November—Cowloe residential meeting. We are very excited about being able to run residential trips next year, but understand that for some this may cause a little anxiety. On Friday we will show you where the children will be going and what the activities will be. We look forward to seeing many of you there.

We have expressed our preferences, considered the purpose and explored some of the more tricky vocabulary. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting multiples of 100 and spotting patterns in the different columns. Year 4 have also explored negative numbers with much success.

In our topic lessons, we have been learning about different animal diets and have started to learn how to sketch using different pencils and experimenting with shading ready to draw our own predator next week. I think the highlight of our week though was of course forest school which was incredibly exciting with lots of digging, planting, water play and shelter building happening along with finding out how to explore our environment safely. We are already looking forward to next week!
