Aire class round up


As well as spotting seasonal changes in the garden, Aire class have been reading Dear Zoo, using their own adjectives and animal suggestions to create a new version! Some of the zoo animals escaped so children worked together to track them and create suitable enclosures to keep them safe. Children have also explored balancing and weighing while making a cake together. Reception have practiced their number recognition to while playing dice games and have learnt the sounds s, a, t and p. Year 1 have perfected using a numberline (creating a giant one together) and have explored the riches of using adjectives in their writing.




Brisons class round up

This week, Brisons have been planning and writing their own stories about going back in time to the Stone Age. They had to use adjectives to describe their characters and settings and think of exciting things that might happen. In phonics we have been recapping sounds from phase 3 and focusing on nonsense words by making up silly names for different aliens. In maths, we have been looking at partitioning numbers to 100 and looking at tens and ones. It has been wonderful to see so many children making it to the 'brain stretcher tasks' and we have been focusing on our spoken explanations.






Longships class round up

Longships class have continued to work incredibly hard this week. We have been exploring verbs through the use of mime, and have used these to plan our own Stone Age adventures. In Maths, we have been continuing with place value and discovering what happens to each digit when we add or subtract 1, 10 or 100.

We demonstrated excellent research skills to find out how people lived during the Stone Age in Skara Brae.



Cowloe class round up

We have begun to plan our narratives based on a different point of view and we have used DADWAVERS to help us think about our sentence starters. In Maths we have been comparing and ordering numbers up to ten million and looking at how numbers can be represented in different ways. The children have been looking at how The Maya people wrote using glyphs and had a go at drawing some of their own which we found quite tricky. We also began our Science which is Life Cycles and habitats and we enjoyed a nature hunt around the school grounds.









Symptom	Action
Temperature New, continuous cough (NHS describes this as having at least 3 'coughing fits' in 24 hrs) Loss of taste or smell	 Do not come to school, contact school to notify Follow <u>Covid</u> 'Stay at home guidance' Contact NHS 111 or visit NHS 111 online and arrange a <u>Covid</u> test If negative, return to school once well enough If positive, continue follow 'Stay at home guidance'
