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

AIRE CLASS - Last week's highlight was our first Beach School, where the children enjoyed using the sea-water for their Maths capacity activities. Many thanks to the parents who helped us with this. We are also very grateful to all the parents who have accompanied us to our swimming lessons, and are glad to be swimming again this week. For this second week of the half-term, we have been starting some new projects. The children have enjoyed making the Titanic role-play in the classroom, following their own planning for it last week: some great ideas for using different resources. Some of the children were shocked that the Titanic didn't have a McDonalds or TV on it!. We have been learning about the different rock formations that give our classes their names -Aire, Brisons and Cowloe, drawing these and writing about them. We have also enjoyed reading 'The Great Kapok Tree' and starting our Lafrowda withy butterflies. In Maths, our current virtue of Resourcefulness has been very much to the fore, as we have been finding halves of objects, shapes and quantities. Next week, we start to look at quarters too...

BRISONS CLASS - We have had a fun-filled week this week, and the children thoroughly enjoyed making bread. Caterlink came in and ran an excellent bread making workshop. We learnt about the origins of bread, which linked perfectly with our Ancient Egyptian topic. The children expertly kneaded the dough and were very creative with their shapes. We enjoyed eating this together in the afternoon and many children requested the recipe. The children have enthusiastically started making for Lafrowda, we have started the structures for leaves and flowers. In Maths, we have finished fractions and

COWLOE CLASS - We have had a fantastic start to the half term. The children have begun to work on their persuasive writing unit, focussing on letter writing. We have been researching the negative effects of single use plastic and used their understanding to write a letter to the government asking for supermarkets to reduce their use of plastic packaging. The children have also been introduced to the story, The Great Kapok Tree. This tells the story of what happens when we chop down trees in the rainforest. We will be learning about deforestation and the impact of this on our planet. The story is also our focus for Lafrowda this year. This week we began making our models for the Lafrowda festival, where the children chose an animal from the story to create using the willow. They will begin painting them next week. In Maths, the children have been reading and writing decimals using place value counters and base ten. The use of manipulatives has really helped build their confidence and understanding. The Year 6 children have been gathering data and drawing line graphs.

Next week is our residential trip to Heatree. Please remember to check the kit list and bring in a packed lunch on Monday. We will open the doors at

8.30am for the children on the trip so that we can collect medication and leave promptly at 9.15am. I am really excited for the visit and look forward to keeping you updated on the fun we are having. COWLOE LEARNING LEGEND is Izzy. Izzy has taken her time in maths this week and shown great resilience. When she found a new concept challenging

she persevered and used the manipulatives available to help develop her understanding. Well done Izzy!

HEAD TEACHER - Exciting news! Wicksteed are beginning the first phase of our new playground on Monday! They are going to be clearing the land and installing the trim trail. The company have completed a thorough risk assessment for working on site while the children are in school and have decided to fence off the areas they are working on for the safety of the children.
