Christmas performances

I know that it has been a concerning time recently regarding Covid information in the media. We have been thinking long and hard about our Christmas performances over the last week and trying to decide what the best solution is. We have a responsibility to keep our staff and pupils as safe as possible, while giving them the opportunity to do a very much desired performance. The official guidance states that schools are free to make their own decisions based on local data, premises layout and risk assessments. We have made the decision that we will be going ahead with live performances of all our shows. We will do them in the main hall with the following measures in place:

- 2 guests per family only—we plan to put the chairs in 2s with a small distance between each pair to allow for social distancing.
- The stage will be in one half of the hall, with at least 2 metres between the stage and the front of the audience.
- Masks will be recommended for audience members
- Public Health England have also recommended that anyone attending takes a Lateral Flow Test before attending.

I hope you will agree that this is a good compromise to our normal shows but we feel that these will help ensure that everyone is able to go on to have a nice, healthy Christmas!

Christmas parties—We have decided to have our Christmas parties as separate classes again this year—the idea of the whole school being sweaty in the hall together seems a bit too much of a risk so close to the end of term. The class teachers will have a special afternoon in their classes instead. They will let you know individually which day it will be. We have a tradition for our Christmas parties that Santa brings the gift of a book. We are hoping that the big man will still pay us a visit during our parties, so we are asking you to provide a book that you know your child will like, wrap it up and send it into school (secretly!) so that we can give them out on party day! Any questions, just ask!:)




Longships class round up

This week in Longships we have been starting to find out about the different features of a recount. We have also been working hard on our understanding of subjects and verbs within sentences, reminding ourselves how to use paragraphs as well as learning about consonant and vowel sounds to help us to choose whether to use 'a' or 'an' before a noun.

In maths, we have been using number lines and Base 10 to understand how to subtract. Year 4 have started to use the more formal method of column subtraction.

In our topic lessons we have been exploring how lions hunt their prey which helped us to write fantastic instructions. Our Science lesson was great fun when we dissected owl pellets to explore whether owls produced a pellet after every creature they ate. We found this not to be the case as many pellets had several skulls inside them. We ended the week by making some eco-friendly Christmas decorations that the children worked really hard on and were keen to put their own creative spin on. The children can't wait to sell these to you on the final week, so look out for details of this soon.



Cowloe class round up

This week we have started our writing based on the book Holes by Louis Sacher. The children have been using precise vocabulary to write a detailed description of a lizard. In Maths we have finished division and been learning the words factors, multiples and prime numbers. Can you ask them to explain these to you? We looked at the legend of Robin Hood and talked about the justice system in medieval times and compared them to today. We also talked about prejudice and discrimination in PSHE and used different scenarios to explain this to each other. We have also been practising our play. It would be great if the children knew their lines next week so we don't need the scripts anymore. Thank you .








Lunch Menu
