
Parent feedback Summer 2021

Even better if...

More sporting activities

As part of our Sports Premium funding, we are hoping to use expertise in our area (Rugby, cricket, gymnastics, tennis etc) to provide our children with a wider range of sporting experiences. The new mini bus means that we will be able to take the children in small teams to competitions in the local area. Swimming will restart with the older children first.

Time after reports are issued to speak to teachers regarding concerns or if clarification is required.

This does usually happen, however due to lockdowns, teachers wanted as long as possible to teach the content. This meant we left reporting until the very end. This year we are aiming to send them out a little earlier.

More information regarding children's progress.

This year parents will receive 3 assessment reports (1 per term) following our teacher assessments. These will show your child's current achievements and next steps in learning. We will also continue with Parent's evenings and end of year reports. We intend to have parents in each term for an end of topic celebration, but we will of course have to keep our eye on current restrictions.

A small amount of homework would be helpful for the older children and prepare them better for secondary school.

This is on our School Development Plan for this year. We will be sending out a survey to parents to find out what an acceptable level of homework would be and then creating a new policy that suits our children and their families.

Offer more activities after school

We will be increasing our offer this year, subject to restrictions remaining lifted, and are hoping to offer a wider variety of activities

Working with parents more at home when struggling in certain areas. Would be happy to sit and explain maths etc in advance of the classroom lessons to increase confidence and greater understanding in the whole class setting.

We will be sending out a questionnaire asking what workshops parents would like this year and we will do our best to facilitate them. Please don't be afraid to speak to your child's class teacher if you would like any support though, they would be happy to help.

I would love to see Forest school or similar activities built in, on a weekly basis, going into the older years. Outdoor education is very important to us. It is very much our intention to continue Forest School through the School. We are hoping to train up another member of staff this year to be able to increase our offer. Our new minibus will enable us to take the children to other woodland settings too this year as well.
