28/02/2020; Heron, for settling in so well at Sennen School, and starting to show resilience by 'having a go' at activities independently.

LONGSHIPS CLASS - Over the last 2 weeks we have been looking at a video called 'Ride of Passage'. We learned how to use pronouns to make our writing flow better and recapped the use of apostrophes. We imagined what the characters might be saying to one another and used it to practise our speech punctuation. In maths we have been continuing to use formal methods of multiplication, spotting errors and solving problems. For our morning work, have spent time recapping addition and subtraction to check we can still remember how to do it! We have also been practising our times tables regularly both in written form and online. This is something we will be continuing to practise over the coming weeks. BRISONS CLASS - In Maths we've been collecting data in tally charts and presenting this information in pictograms. Then we've answered questions by reading the pictograms and comparing the data. In English we've been planning our own stories and the children have been really ambitious with their vocabulary. Our rainforest topic has inspired a good deal of home learning as well as lots of hard work in school. Recently we have looked at different types of rainforests and compared them as well as where we

cowlos class - We have enjoyed getting stuck into our new topic Ancient Greece and have been learning about the famous Greek Myths. We have looked at a variety of myths, the heroes and mythological creatures in them. The children have independently researched the Greek Gods and have been creating their own beast to appear in their own myth. We have also looked at how we use artefacts to learn about the past and the children looked at a

selection of Greek vases; designing their own which look amazing! In Maths we have been studying geometry; reading and plotting coordinates and translating and reflecting shapes in all 4 quadrants. Next Year 6 will be revising decimals and percentages while the Year 5 children will look at fractions. We will continue to become fluent in our times tables too as these are so important. This week we celebrated world book day and the children looked great in their outfits.
