
Recommended read

For those looking for a good book to read their child when talking about the challenges of war, this week's recommended read is a great choice.

The blurb on the back states:

Imagine if, on an ordinary day, war came. Imagine it turned your town to rubble. Imagine going on a long and difficult journey – all alone. Imagine finding no welcome at the end of it. Then imagine a child who gives you something small but very, very precious...

When the government refused to allow 3000 child refugees to enter this country in 2016, Nicola Davies was so angry she wrote a poem. It started a campaign for which artists contributed drawings of chairs, symbolising a seat in a classroom, education, kindness, the hope of a future. The poem has become this book, movingly illustrated by Rebecca Cobb, which should



prove a powerful aid for explaining the ongoing refugee crisis to younger readers.



Aire class round up

This week the children have really enjoyed the wordless storybook Bee and Me; they have learnt about how bees make honey and their role on pollination. They have sowed bee bombs in Christopher's garden, they have eaten honey and described the taste of it, they have painted in the style of Jackson Pollock to show the colour that bees add to our world and they have used bubble wrap to create honeycomb prints. In Maths they have used the part part whole model to investigate ways of making numbers to 10. We have also celebrated two birthdays and have baked a cake for each one - the children are becoming so independent in these activities. Over the last two weeks, the children have also built a cold frame in which we have sowed lettuce, tomatoes, pumpkin, cress and peppers.

The children found some parts tricky, but we talked a lot about resilience and how we learn from our mistakes. 
Cowloe class round up

















Easter trail
