

Science

Intent:

To learn about the similarities and differences between animals and humans.

Prior learning—Year 2 will have covered some of this in the 'animals including humans' topic so will be building on her learning. Year 1 have looked at features of animals in their 'pets' topic.

Sequence of learning

Lesson 1: Re-cap quiz to find out their prior

Lesson 2: To discuss the variety of animals and discuss which types have babies which grow in to adults.

Lesson 3: To identify the common animal's carnivores, herbivores and omnivores to include what basic needs animals including humans need to survive.

Lesson 4: Discuss the structure of a variety of common animals including the ones which we have discussed in session 2.

Lesson 5: Looking at the structure of the different types of animals and then discuss which part of their body's relate to their senses and how that compares to us.

Lesson 6: Relating back to session three talk about the basic needs of animals then think about what humans need to survive and how it is important to exercise eat a balanced diet and keep clean.

Next steps—All children will build on this learning during their 'amazing animals' topic.

Outcome

Children will identify the differences between animals and humans including their body parts and basic needs.

Intent:

Sequence of learning -

Lesson 2: IT in school. They will learn to identify different examples of IT used in schools.

Lesson 3: IT in the world. They will explore the use of IT in different environments and why its used.

Lesson 4: The benefits of IT. Children will explore the benefits of IT in the wider world.

Lesson 5: Using IT safely. The children will how they use different forms of IT safety in different environments.

Lesson 6: Using IT in different ways. The children will thin about the choices that they are making when using IT.

Next steps—The children will be using the IT in school to create media in the form of photography.
