This week we have been editing and producing a final draft of our diary entries. We wrote them as explorers entering an ancient Egyptian tomb and they were just fab—so much to be proud of! We have also started looking at instructions and we had a go at following some to mummify a tomato. This was very messy but great fun and led to some thoughtful decisions about what features good instructions have. We have learned about the ancient art of embalming and have been incredible at remembering the 9 different steps.

In maths we have worked on number lines to find out missing values and estimate the position of given numbers. We found out the it involved lots of division and counting skills.
