<u>Ukraine appeal</u>

We have had some enquiries about whether we will be holding a collection point for aid items to send to the Ukraine. Some of the items are not really appropriate to collect in a school setting, plus we are a little short on space, but we have liaised with the community centre and they are doing a collection on Friday mornings only. We are happy to collect contributions on Friday morning and take them over to the Community centre at the correct time. We are unable to accept items earlier that Friday as we are unable to store them safely away from the children. Items that are currently being requested by the relevant agencies are pain killers, burn creams and first aid kits, foil blankets, wet wipes, sterile dressings, nappies tampons, dried milk, general toiletries and very specific clothes such as good base layers. No general clothing please.

Recently we have been working with Sue Sayer from Cornwall Seal Trust Research Trust and Connie & Andrew who volunteer for several marine based groups such as BDMLR amongst others. We loved finding out about some of the different species in our local environment & discovering how we can help them. We have begun planning an information text to share all that we have learned and are hoping to share this with our visitors.

We have also loved exploring electrical circuits by investigating conductors and insulators. We were amazed to find that graphite from a pencil was also a conductor even though it isn't a metal.

Our weekly ukulele lessons are also going well in which we are learning about tempo and have loved singing and playing many fun songs.



Cowloe class round up

It has been a strange couple of weeks but it's lovely to have nearly everyone back now! We have been working hard on our biography writing on the life of Charles Darwin and we are learning so much about his travels on HMS Beagle and what he discovered. We have used atlases to plot his journey and learnt what he discovered at each destination. In Science we have learnt how plants, in particular the cactus and water lily, have evolved over time and begun to understand the term survival of the fittest. The children also learnt some very important first aid skills this week and know how to help someone who may be choking. I was very impressed with how seriously they took this and hopefully now they will think about how they can avoid choking by sitting whilst eating and not guzzling their food!
