Brisons— Teddy for his excellent attitude to learning. He has made great progress in his reading and his mental maths has been very impressive this week!

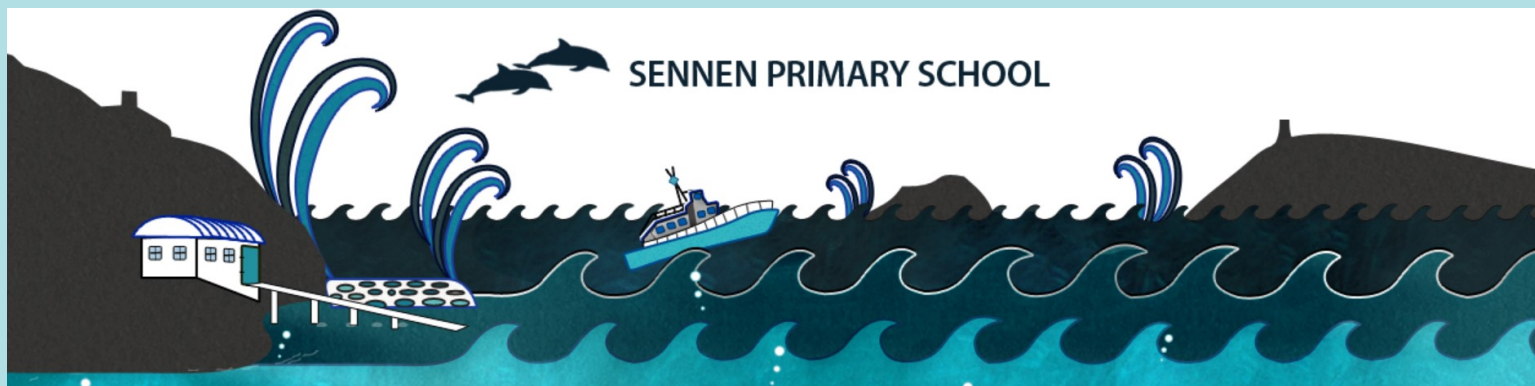
Longships— Mabel for being a kind friend by supporting people with joining in with games on the playground. We are so proud of you.

Brisons class round up

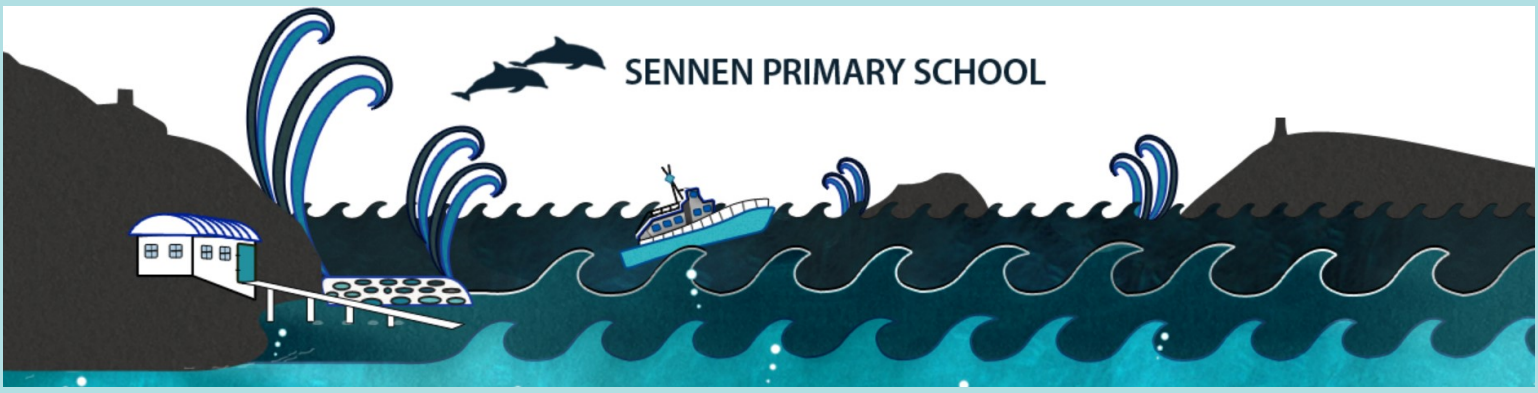

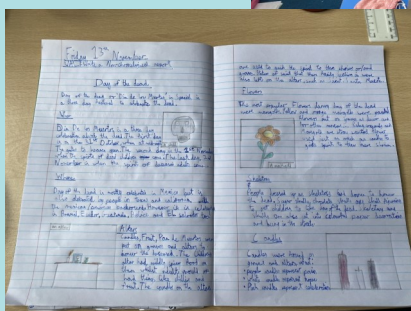
In English, we have chosen a country in South America and have begun researching it in order to create a fact file next week.

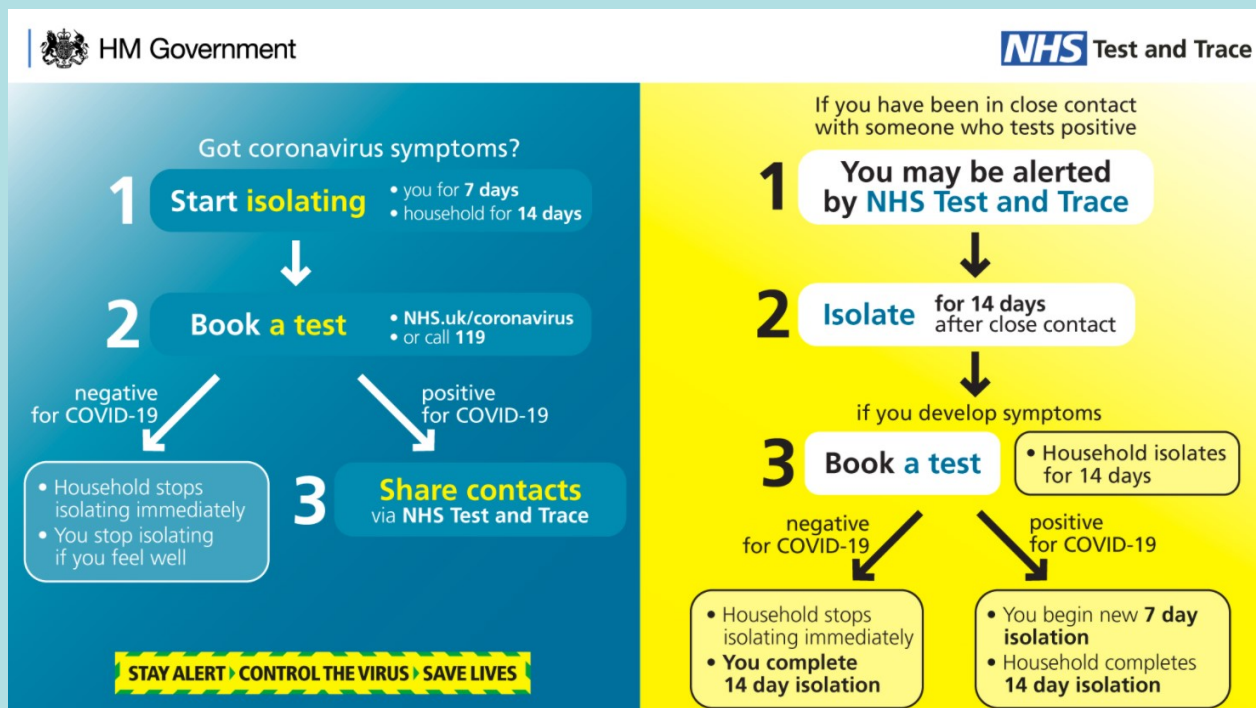
