



Headteacher's message

What a lovely week it has been! I have loved going into classes and seeing all of the learning that is going on in the classrooms. Year 5/6 have been looking at a book called 'The boy, the horse, the fox and the mole' and I was so inspired by their ideas and thoughts. I think in these times we all need a bit of kindness to get us through. As a staff, we have been talking about how we can support the children during lockdown, especially thinking about all of the things that they have missed. We are replacing staff as much as we can and look forward to seeing all of our lovely staff back as soon as they are able.

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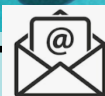
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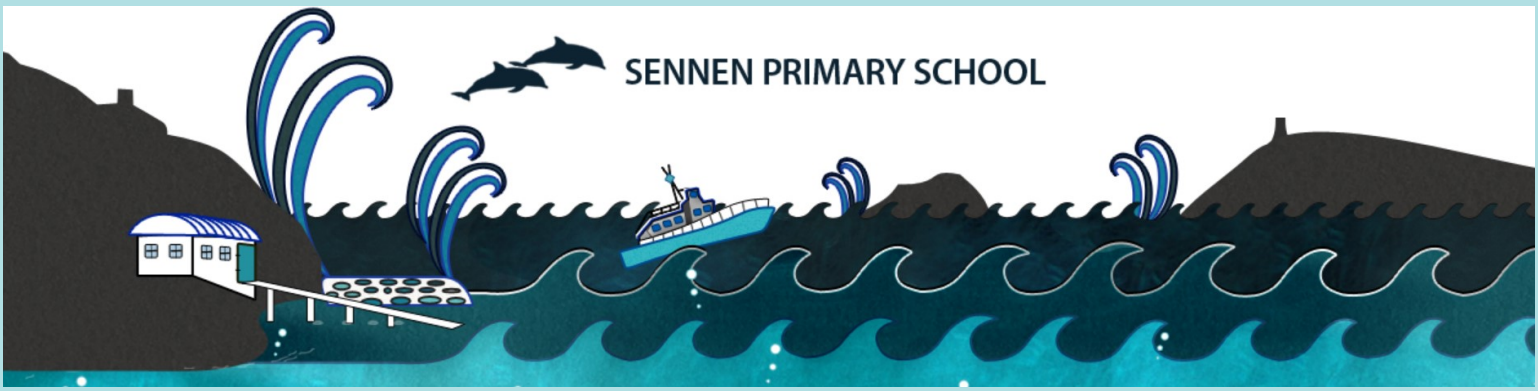

Year 1 did a spot of shopping in the role play area to explore subtraction more fully. 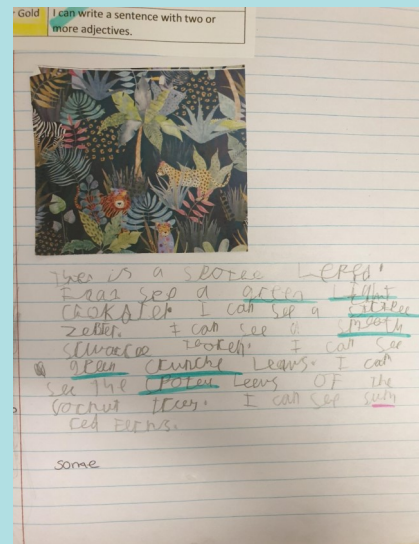
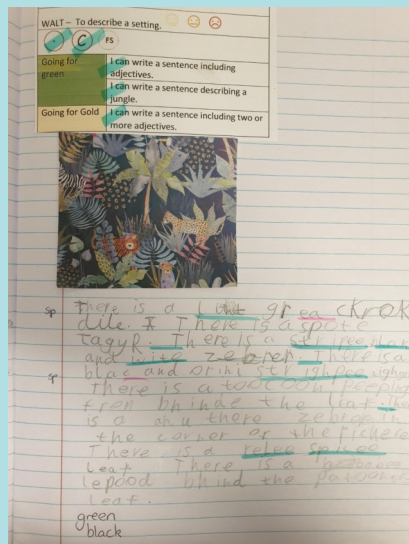
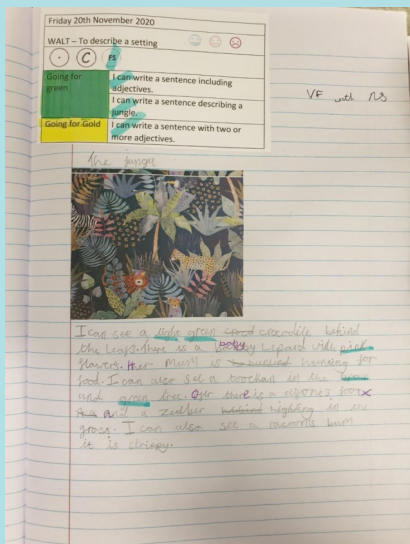


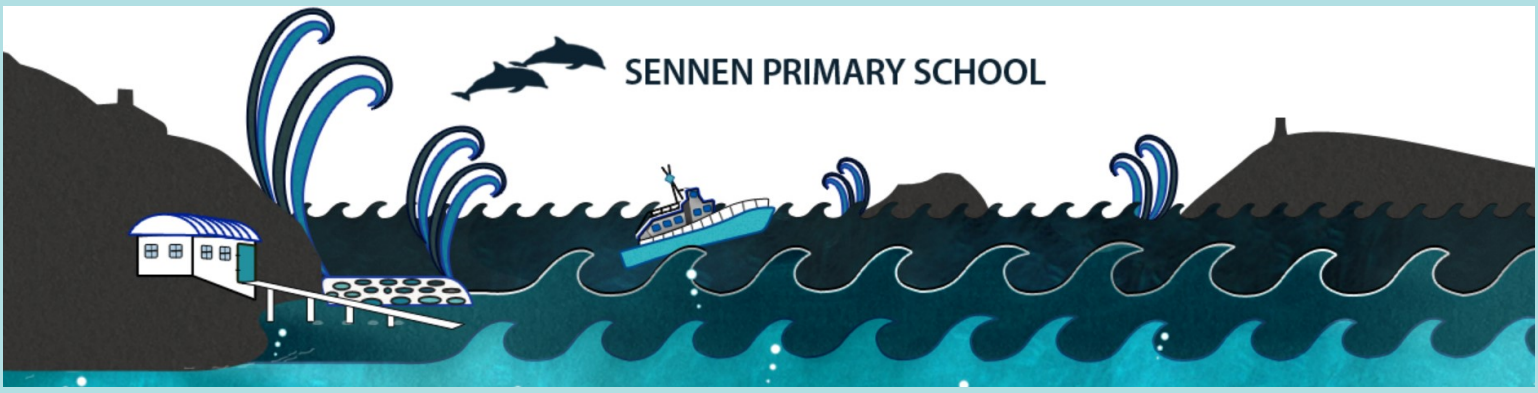
Brisons class round up

This week Brisons have been looking at an animation called 'Ride of passage'. They have been sequencing the story and then using adjectives to describe the setting. They are getting so good at their joined up writing—we are so proud of them! They have also been practising their phonics, especially their nonsense words, and looking at applying their spelling patterns to their writing.

In maths we have continued to use our number bonds to 10 to add bigger numbers. This required thinking differently, which was challenging for some, but we absolutely nailed it in the end!

We have continued our Geography topic and have begun to find out about the Geographical features of South America.

Longships have had a fantastic week of showing superb teamwork which started by considering how we communicate when building a group tower. We have been able to continue our teamwork strategies all week and apply it to the other areas of learning.

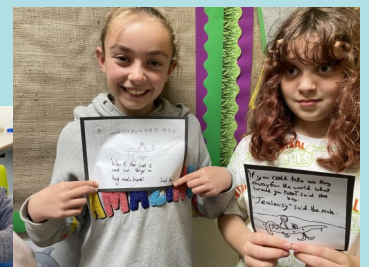
Maths has been based around strategies for addition with a particular focus on using place value counters to notice what happens when we need to exchange.

We have written words of positivity and used descriptive techniques to write a short poem. In Maths, we have been multiplying 4 digits by 1 digit using the formal written method and we are moving onto long multiplication. In Science, we have been comparing life cycles and researching different types of birds, creating a colourful information page. We will be learning about how plants and flowers reproduce and have a go at growing our own plants next week.

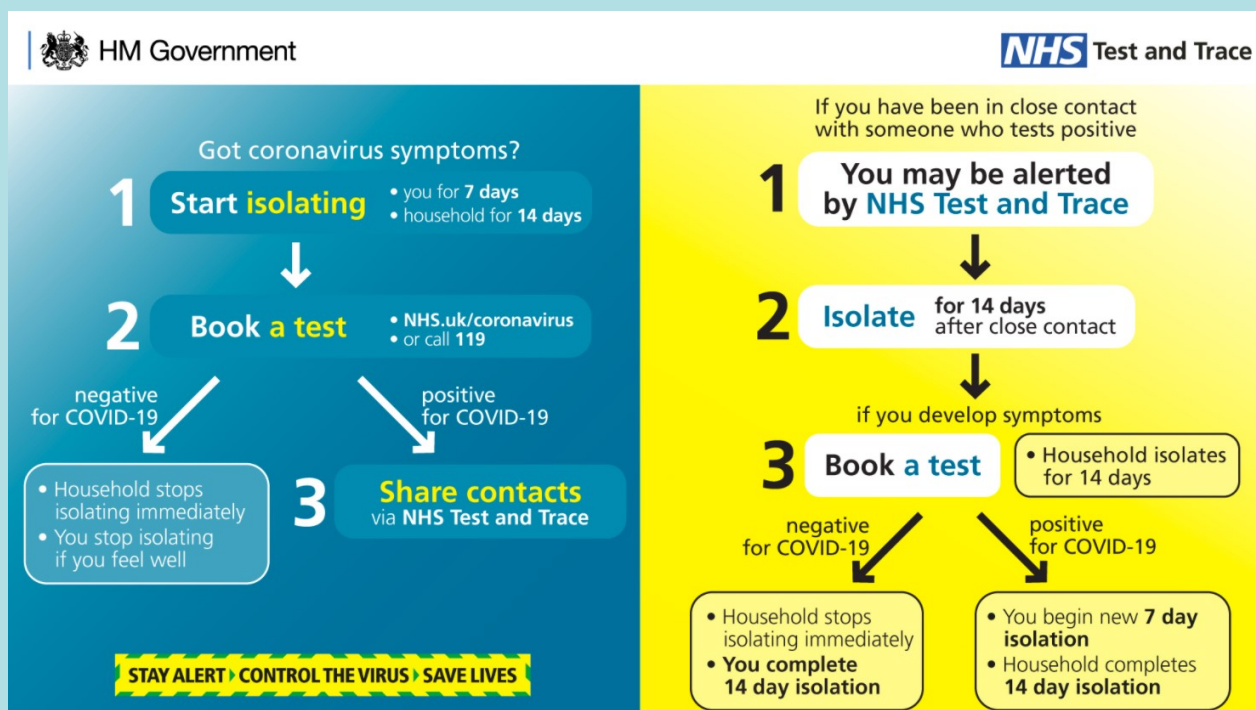
